### 1. The BoA ADR service

- The procedure must involve two parties (inter partes), excluding the Office
- All users involved in appeal proceedings before the Boards of Appeal
- Special effective dispute resolution service for SMEs involved in:
  - opposition proceedings under the EUTMR
  - cancellation proceedings under the EUTMR
  - •RCD invalidity proceedings

# **MEDIATION TOOLKIT: MEDIATION AND CONCILIATION techniques**

### **ASSISTED NEGOTIATION**

- Process in which an impartial facilitator will coach an unrepresented SME in their negotiations with another party to reach an amicable agreement
- The facilitator's task consists in assessing the underlying circumstances of the dispute coaching on appropriate strategies and techniques on negotiation and on engaging in effective dialogue with the other party
- The facilitator does not take part in the negotiation process



# EFFECTIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (EDR) SME COVID-19 special service



The special service is offered, as of 1<sup>st</sup> July 2020, in the following EUIPO proceedings (for the first time also in the first instance)

Opposition proceedings

RCD invalidities, and appeals

Cancelations,

 After the end of the cooling-off period and only por unrepresented SMEs.

• For both <u>represented and unrepresented</u> SMEs at any stage of these proceedings.

# 2. Legal basis: EUTMR and EU Mediation Directive

# The general principles of the EU Mediation Directive

- >Encourage the use of mediation to facilitate dispute resolution in the EU
- ➤ Help citizens **avoid** the **worry**, **time** and **cost** of court **litigation**, and thus enable them to secure their legal rights in an **efficient** way
- > Encourage the training of mediators and to ensure high quality of mediation
- >Ensure confidentiality
- ➤ Give judges the power to invite disputants to try mediation first, where appropriate
- Ensure that parties who choose mediation in an attempt to settle a dispute are **not subsequently prevented** from initiating judicial proceedings or arbitration
- >Enforceability of agreements resulting from mediation, if the parties so agree



# 2. Legal basis: EUTMR and EU Mediation Directive

- Preamble 35 EUTMR and relevant provisions on cancellation and opposition: The EUIPO shall facilitate the amicable settlement of disputes relating to EU trade marks and Community designs on the basis of mutual agreement
- Article 151.3 EUTMR: The Office may provide voluntary mediation services with a view to helping the parties to reach an amicable settlement.
- Article 170 EUTMR: The legal basis for the establishment of a mediation centre for the purpose of Article 151.3 EUTMR.



# 2. Legal basis

- ✓ Mediation: Decision No 2013-3 of the Presidium of the Boards of Appeal of 5 July 2013 on the amicable settlement of disputes
- ✓ Conciliation: Decision No 2014-2 of the Presidium of the Boards of Appeal of 31 January 2014 on the amicable settlement of disputes by the competent Board, amended on 1 July 2020
- ✓ Assisted negotiation (SMEs): Decision No 2020-4 of the Presidium of the Boards of Appeal of 17 June 2020
- ✓ Expert determination: Decision No 2020-3 of the Presidium of the Boards of Appeal of 9 June 202



# **EUIPO** mediation process



# Mediation is a dispute resolution tool offered by the EUIPO in appeal proceedings

- ✓ Included in the appeal fee
- ✓ Voluntary in nature
- ✓ Available to represented or unrepresented parties

# Initiation

- ✓ Unilateral request
- ✓ Bilateral request
- ✓ Proposal of rapporteur



# **Mediation planning and first contacts**

Mediator sends the parties a **letter of introduction**:

- ✓ Requesting selection of the mediation venue (or online)
- ✓ Asking for a range of available dates for the mediation
- ✓ Insisting that **business decision-takers** be present (authority to bind)
- ✓ Attaching the **mediation agreement** (including **confidentiality annex**) for signature
- ✓ Setting timeframe for receiving a summary of the case




# **The Mediation Day**

- 1. Initial joint session
- 2. Break out into alternating individual caucuses (private sessions) with the parties
- 3. Possible **intermittent joint sessions** (particularly as bargaining progresses)
- 4. Drafting of heads of agreement/MoU
- 5. Conclusion on next steps



### Mediation Types of ADR services Conciliation Hide Types of ADR services offered Conciliation is a voluntary process in which a conciliator **proactively suggests possible** The ADRS offers the services below, which can be used in combination with one another or separately, according to solutions to the dispute. These proposals will be discussed, negotiated and fine-tuned with the the needs of the interested parties. parties, who remain at all times free to accept or decline the proposed solution. Mediation The conciliator will be in charge of guiding the conciliation process and will submit a proposal for the Show settlement of the dispute, if he or she considers there is a reasonable prospect that it could be accepted by the parties and an end put to the dispute. It must be stressed that the decision to conciliate is purely voluntary and requires the consent of all parties to the dispute. Conciliation Show The procedure differs from mediation in that the conciliator makes proposals as to how the dispute could be swiftly settled whereas in mediation the mediator usually does not make proposals but works with the parties to assist them in formulating their own proposals. **Assisted Negotiation** When suitable, conciliation may be suggested by the Rapporteur of a case pending at the Boards of Appeal. However, it can also be requested by one or both parties, using a unilateral or joint request form. In all cases, the consent of all parties to the dispute will be needed. # Model ADR Contractual clauses

### Model ADR contractual clauses

The ADRS provides model ADR contractual clauses to facilitate party agreement to settle potential disputes amicably.

Parties wishing to refer to EUIPO ADR are encouraged to include an appropriate ADR clause into any commercial contract in connection with IP rights. This allows contracting parties to agree that, in case any future dispute arises, they will use an alternative form of dispute resolution (such as mediation) as a step prior to court proceedings.

The recommended clauses have been drafted with the support of the ADR Stakeholder Advisory Board (SAB), reflecting best practices for mediation and other dispute resolution modalities.
