SALIENT FEATURES

Extends TRIPS Art.23.1 high level of protection to goods outside wines & spirits







SALIENT FEATURES

Disclaimer of generic, common or Customary name component of a GI

In general, a name or term is considered generic, customary or common if it is understood by the general public in the Philippines or the relevant consumers of the goods covered by the geographical indication to be the product itself or the name and denomination used to refer to the goods themselves.

Evocation







Case C-614/17

SALIENT FEATURES

Refusal if the name is an evocation of an earlier filed or registered GI

term, sign, or other labelling or packaging device that *presents a direct and clear link* with the product covered by a protected GI in the mind of the reasonably intelligent consumer, thereby exploiting, weakening, diluting or being detrimental to the reputation of the registered names







SALIENT FEATURES

ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES

ANY INTERESTED PARTY MAY FILE

- Pre-registration: THIRD-PARTY OBSERVATION (opposition)
- Post Registration: REVOCATION







SPECIAL PROVISIONS

INDIGENOUS CULTURAL COMMUNITIES/ INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

Waiver of Fees: The Director General is authorized to grant a partial or total waiver of fees for applications filed by recognized indigenous cultural communities/indigenous peoples

Capacitate and Assist: In the filing of the applications and compliance with the prescribed requirements









GAP IN THE CURRENT LEGAL FRAMEWORK

Lack of Explicit Enforcement Mechanisms

- Administrative penalties for unauthorized use of GIs
- Ex-officio actions by the Registrar to investigate violations without a complaint

GAP IN THE CURRENT LEGAL FRAMEWORK

INADEQUATE QUALITY CONTROL PROVISIONS

The Regulations require a Manual Specifications, but does not mandate the establishment of a control system







PROPOSED GI LEGISLATION


- Provision on GI infringement offense against the economic interest of the State, and prescribes the corresponding penalty therefor [Sec.39, 40]
- Manual of Specifications control system [Sec.3 (h)]
- Provision re: Roles of Relevant Government Agencies – development and protection of GI [Sec.12]





SEC. 169 (FALSE DESIGNATIONS OF ORIGIN; FALSE DESCRIPTION OR REPRESENTATION) SEC. 170 (PENALTIES)

- Use of false/misleading designations of origin, descriptions, or representations in commerce that:
 - Cause confusion/deception about affiliation, origin, or approval of goods/services.
 - Misrepresent the nature, quality, or geographic origin of goods/services in advertising.
- ❖ Liability: Civil action for damages and injunctions (Sec. 156–157) by affected parties.








SEC. 169 (FALSE DESIGNATIONS OF ORIGIN; FALSE DESCRIPTION OR REPRESENTATION) SEC. 170 (PENALTIES)

Customs Enforcement (Sec. 169.2):

- Goods with false origin labels are barred from importation into the Philippines.
- Importers may appeal under customs laws or seek remedies under the IP Code.

❖ Penalties:

- Imprisonment 2-5 years
- Fines P50,000-P200,000
