

# How GI is Protected in Brunei Darussalam



# Brunei does not have a sui generis system for GI

GI protection is subsumed under Trademarks Act (Cap 98)

GI can be registered as Collective or Certification mark



## **COLLECTIVE MARKS**

# **Section 50 of Trademarks Act:**

"a mark distinguishing the goods or services of <u>members of an association</u> which is the <u>proprietor of that mark from</u> those of other undertakings"



# **CERTIFICATION MARKS**



# **Section 52 of Trademarks Act:**

"a mark indicating that the goods or services in connection with which it is used are certified by the proprietor of that mark in respect of origin, material, mode or manufacture of goods or performance of services, quality, accuracy or other characteristics"



## REGULATION FILING

Rule 56 (2): "Within 9 months of the date of the application for the registration of a collective or certification mark, the applicant shall file form TM 23 accompanied by a copy of the regulations governing the use of the mark."



# Issues arising from Brunei's lack of a sui generis system

- There will be marks that are GIs but does not necessarily fall within the category of collective / certification marks
  - Marks end up being filed as normal mark (trademark)
  - o E.g. Brunei 100% Kelulut Honey



# 2) Regulations surrounding the use of the certification / collective marks

 Producers would need to gain authorisation/licence from the proprietor



Producers should be free to use GI



3) Requirement of acquired distinctiveness for geographical names to be registrable.

Distinctiveness can be achieved:-

- a. through use; or
- b. the mark identifies a particular product, service, without indicating any geographical origin








