

INTRODUCTION




Geographical Indications Act 2000 defines geographical indication as an indication which identifies any goods as originating in a country or territory, or a region or locality in that country or territory, where a given quality, reputation or other characteristic of the goods is essentially attributable to their geographical origin.



Malaysian Pepper Board as a registered proprietor of Geographical Indication has the exclusive rights to exploit the geographical indication and gains recognition at domestic and international level for "Sarawak Pepper".

WHY SHOULD GI...



Registration of geographical indication is based on an affiliation ownership concept for the producers who are carrying on an activity in that specified geographical area and not an individual ownership concept.

It is not compulsory but encouraged to protect the interest of producer and consumer.



On the other hand, a geographical indication indicates where the goods are produced and has characteristics that are attributable to the place of the geographical origin.

GEOGRAPHICAL INDICATIONS FOR SARAWAK PEPPER



Malaysian Pepper Board is the Registered proprietor of Sarawak Pepper Brand Name

Registered under the GI Act 2000

Certificate No. G103-00001 Since: 4th November 2003 Expiry:4th November 2023

- Primarily to protect the image of Sarawak Pepper both locally and abroad
- To protect Sarawak Pepper in any forms (whole, ground, pickled, etc) and all graded pepper, value added pepper products and pepper-based products from Malaysia

CHRONOLOGY: GI REGISTRATION FOR SARAWAK PEPPER

- Application for GI registration for Sarawak Pepper:31st October 2003
- Receipt of application (MyIPO): 4th November 2003
- Advertisement for registration: 31st December 2003
- Opposition to application : Nil
- Gazette notification: 20thMei 2004
- Renewed: 15th Nov. 2013
- Expiry date: 4th Nov. 2023

THE SCOPE OF PROTECTION OF A GI.

- Geographical indication's protection in Malaysia is territorial.
- As a statutory body established under the Malaysian Pepper Board Act 2006, MPB oversees all pepper related activities in the country, including the grading of all pepper for export.
- Sarawak Pepper within the scope of a GI.

CERTIFICATE OF ORIGIN OF GOODS (COO)

- GI Certification as an evidence that certifies that Sarawak Pepper in a particular export shipment are wholly obtained, produced, manufactured or processed in Malaysia.
- Its also serve as a declaration by the pepper exporters that registered under Malaysian Pepper Board.

CONCLUSION

Registrations for GIs are not necessary, however geographical indications of Sarawak Pepper enable MPB to obtain numerous benefits including:

- The exclusive right to exploit or use the Sarawak Pepper brand in the course of pepper trade;
- It confers legal protection to Geographical Indications in Malaysia
- Prevents unauthorized use of a Registered Geographical Indication
- It provides legal protection to Malaysian Geographical Indications which in turn boost pepper exports.
- It promotes economic prosperity of pepper industry players in a Malaysia territory.
