How to protect GIs abroad ?

Direct applications in third countries

Individual application

Bilateral or pluri-lateral agreements

Under such agreements two or more States or trading partners agree to protect each other's GIs (standard of protection + often GI-list)

Multilateral agreements

- TRIPS Agreement (WTO)
 Protection of G/s
- Madrid Protocol/Agreement (WIPO) Registration of TM
- Lisbon Agreement and Geneva Act (WIPO) *Protection* and *registration* of AOs and GIs under the Geneva Act

The Lisbon System Cost Effective

Facilitates the international protection of AOs and GIs

A single registration procedure ("simple & cost effective")





The Lisbon System Legal Benefits **Covers all kinds of products High level protection** - against any "usurpation" and "imitation" - exceptions: refusal, invalidation, renunciation Indefinite protection in other Lisbon Members, including in futures ones **Protection against "genericity"** Title for taking legal action

The Lisbon System Flexibilities

Inclusion of geographical indications, including transborder geographical indications

no need to distinguish between AOs and GIs in domestic Law

Flexibility as to the type of legislation to protects AOs/GIs in Contracting Parties

sui generis/GI system, trademarks system, etc.

Inclusion of safeguards

- *prior trademarks*; personal names used in business; plant variety or animal breed denominations;
- generic terms;
- possibility for interested parties to request refusal

Accession by intergovernmental organizations Possibility to request individual fees

2 examples of French AO which benefited of Lisbon registrations

- The appellation Champagne was registered in 1967, very early
 - it strengthens the reputation of the appellation in the world, regarding genericity cases, among others
 - It enhanced the level of legal protection in countries Members of the system



- The appellation huile essentielle de lavande Haute-Provence is a small production, which was registered in 1985 before WIPO
 - The registration was a great way to promote and increase the notoriety of the appellation

It made easier protection cases at the international level given the small size of the group of producers
