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THE NICE CLASSIFICATION



Class Headings

 indicate in a general manner the fields to which, the goods or services belong

Explanatory Notes

 clarify the criteria of which type or examples of goods or services are included in the class

Alphabetical List

 may be consulted in order to ascertain the exact classification of individual goods or services by analogy

General Remarks

 a short collection of basic principles explaining what criteria should be applied if a term cannot be classified in accordance with the Class Headings or Alphabetical List

CASE LAW (CJEU) PRAKTICER C-418/02



Terms not presented in the Nice classification

The concept of 'services' referred to by Directive to approximate the laws of the Member States relating to trade marks <u>covers services provided in connection with retail trade</u> in goods

For the purposes of registration of a trade mark for such services, it is not necessary to specify in detail the service(s) in question. <u>However, details must be provided with regard to</u> <u>the goods or types of goods to which those services relate</u>



CASE LAW (CJEU) IP TRANSLATOR C-307/10

Nice classification, class headings

An applicant who uses the general indications of a class heading of the Nice Classification <u>must specify whether its</u> <u>application for registration is intended to cover all the goods</u> <u>or services included in the alphabetical list of that class or only</u> <u>some of those goods or services</u>.

If the application concerns only some of those goods or services, the applicant <u>is required to specify which of the</u> goods or services in that class are intended to be covered.



CASE LAW (CJEU) IP TRANSLATOR C-307/10

Directive:

requires the goods and services to be identified with sufficient clarity and precision to enable the competent authorities and economic operators, to determine the extent of the protection conferred by the trade mark

does not preclude the use of the general indications of the class headings to identify the goods and services for which the protection of the trade mark is sought, provided that such identification is sufficiently clear and precise

COMMON COMMUNICATION CP1

A description of goods and services is <u>sufficiently clear and</u> <u>precise</u> when its scope of protection can be understood from its <u>natural and usual</u> <u>meaning</u> Identifying factors such as characteristics, purpose and/or identifiable <u>market sector</u> consumers and/or sales channels

skills and knowhow to be used/produced

technical capabilities to be used/produced



COMMON COMMUNICATION CP 1

A term may be clear and precise in a particular class without further specification

If protection is sought for a specialised category of goods and services or a specialised market sector further specification of the term may be necessary, for example:

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CASE LAW (CJEU) SKYKICK C-371/18



Directive must be interpreted as meaning that

 Community trade mark or a national trade mark cannot be declared wholly or partially invalid on the ground that terms used to designate the goods and services in respect of which that trade mark was registered lack clarity and precision

Terms such as computer software do lack clarity and precision

CASE LAW T-690/14



Nice classification

TMclass

Taxonomy, has no legal effect, since the scope of protection of an EUTM is always defined by the natural and usual meaning of the terms chosen, not by their position in the hierarchical structure of the Office's taxonomy T-690/ 14 § 66.

CASE LAW (CJEU) BASIC C-400/14 P



The Nice Classification cannot determine, in itself, the nature and characteristics of the services

The explanatory note to Class 39 of the Nice Agreement does not constitute an exhaustive enumeration of the services § 56

CASE LAW T-367/16 and T-89/17

Each term is assessed in the context of the class in which it is applied for T-367/16 § 50; T-89/17 § 32-33
