

The Jamaica Intellectual Property Office (JIPO) is an agency of the Ministry of Industry, Investment and Commerce.

JIPO was established in January 2001 by the Jamaica Intellectual Property Office Act, 2002.





WHAT DO WE DO?

JIPO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR:

- i. ADMINISTERING INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAWS IN JAMAICA;
- ii. PUBLIC EDUCATION;
- iii. REGISTRATION -TRADE MARKS, DESIGNS, PATENTS, GEOGRAPHICAL INDICATIONS
- iv. VOLUNTARY DEPOSITS OF COPYRIGHT AND RELATED RIGHTS

• The National Intellectual Property Strategy requires the involvement of several Ministries, Departments and Agencies to collaborate to achieve this vision.

• The Ministry of Education is one of the ministries that the Jamaica Intellectual Property Office is in collaboration with to promote the importance of intellectual property in schools.




