



# Piracy Funded by Advertising

- 5 758 piracy websites and 538 piracy apps monitored;
- Advertising revenue in 2021: EUR 913m for websites (75% increase from 2020), EUR 58m for apps;
- Add impression rose 39% for websites (Jan-Sept) and 6% for apps (June-Sept).

Online advertising on IPR-Infringing Websites and Apps 2021






